NOTICE TO PRACTITIONERS

Further Expansion of E-lodgment

Practitioners are advised that the Supreme Court has recently further expanded the suite of documents available for e-lodgment. Those documents now include the following:

- Subpoenas to produce
- Subpoenas to give evidence
- Subpoena to give evidence and produce
- Application in Proceeding
- Notice of Discontinuance or withdrawal
- Third Party Notice

Practitioners are reminded of the following:

- Documents **must** be filed by e-lodgment where the document they are seeking to file is available on the portal and the matter is available for e-lodgment to be used.
- Practitioners who are not yet registered for e-lodgment are expected to seek registration expeditiously on commencing or responding to the claim. Parties who delay registering for e-lodgment should expect their documents to be filed in hard-copy with the court registry or via a Canberra agent (if applicable) and should allow sufficient time to do so in advance of any court order deadlines.
